Web sites with no English-language support. Note that while the pages themselves can be made readable using a program such as Google Translate or DeepL Translator, the underlying records or image scans returned in a search will be in the original language and will require the assistance of a translator to read

Ukrainian Shtetl Vital Records (http://uk.wikipedia.org/wiki/Єврейське_містечко) [*in Ukrainian; English-language document index available at Tsal Kaplun Foundation site, please see separate entry*] — image scans from Ukrainian State Archives from the early 19th through the early 20th century for various *guberniyi* (provinces) and *poviti* (districts), including census, voting, school records and metrical (birth/marriage/death/divorce) books
